## The Impact of Good Governance on Inclusive Growth in Selected Countries

## **Abstract**

Inclusive growth has been the focus of much attention in many countries due to Low economic growth and widespread inequalities. Inclusive growth is a development concept that focuses on the process of achieving growth. It is created by opportunities and people's participation in the growth process. Given that the government can take appropriate measures to provide a way for more inclusive growth, there is a close relationship between inclusive growth and government quality. In this regard, this study aims to investigate the relationship between good governance and inclusive growth. For this purpose, the panel data method has been used for two selected groups of middle and high per capita income countries in the period 2010-2018. At first, the multidimensional index of inclusive growth has been measured for two selected groups and it was observed that the average inclusive growth index for high-income countries is higher than for middle-income countries. Estimation results show that in both groups of countries, the good governance index and labor force participation have a positive and significant effect on the inclusive growth index. The consumer price index has a negative effect on the inclusive growth index. It is recommended that middle-income countries pay special attention to institutional reforms to provide the appropriate for people to participate in economic opportunities and achieve inclusive growth.
